Athletes who want to help others

Colin Kaepernick - USA - American Football

Everyone thought Colin Kaepernick was going to be a star. He played well, but he became famous for a different reason. In 2016, Kaepernick was angry at how the police behaved towards young black men. So, before his games, he got down on one knee and did not look at the American flag. Some fans loved it. Others were angry, but Kaepernick continued. He has given almost two million dollars to help black people and started a camp where young people can learn about the law.

Megan Rapinoe – USA – Women's Football

After winning the World Cup, the US women's team complained about their pay. Megan Rapinoe, the team's co-captain, said women trained as hard and won as often as the men's teams. So, they should get the same money. Earlier, Rapinoe wasn't so worried about social problems. Then, she saw Kaepernick's message and agreed. Now, she sees other social problems and thinks the 2020 pandemic has showed how bad the problems are. Rapinoe thinks 'normal' in the future should mean that everyone gets what they need.

Christiano Ronaldo - Portugal - Football

Christiano Ronaldo is one of the greatest players in the history of the UEFA Champions League. Ronaldo is also one of those athletes who cares about people all over the world. He has given millions of pounds – over £5 million in 2015 – to help people in many countries after natural disasters. In 2016, Ronaldo started CR7Selfie, an app that lets people take selfies with him if they give money to the Save the Children charity.

Serena Williams - USA - Tennis

Serena Williams was a world No. 1 in women's tennis and is among the greatest tennis players of all time. Williams wants women in sport to have good careers and fair pay, and she wants a better world for everyone. She has used Facebook and Twitter to share her ideas and got into a few fights there. But Williams is also admired for her efforts, such as working on UNICEF's Schools for Asia programme for 26 million poor children there.

Chris Boardman – UK – Cycling

Chris Boardman was a winner of many cycling races. He is still known as one of the UK's best-ever cyclists, but his interest now is outside of racing. For several years, he talked about cycling races on the radio. But in 2017, he stopped this to do his new job as the city of Manchester's Head of Cycling and Walking. Now Boardman is trying to persuade people to use bikes instead of cars, and wants to improve traffic laws to protect cyclists.



Drone is an old word with a modern meaning

The word *drone* with its oldest meaning, is a sound. It's a low *buzz* or *hum*, and if you don't know what these words mean, say them slowly. You'll hear the meaning. Words that sound like *drone* are found in ancient Greek and in old English and German, and many other languages.

- **46.** ____ Long ago, people began to use the word to describe male bees. These boy bees make noise, but only the female worker bees make the honey. So, people used *drone* to mean something that doesn't do anything, such as a bee or a person who doesn't produce very much.
- **47.** ____ Drone also describes one of the sounds a Scottish bagpipe makes. This musical instrument's high notes play the tune, while one pipe makes a continuous low, droning sound. This use of *drone* for the drone pipe began in the 1500s and is still used today.



- **49.** ____ Since 1946, we've used the word *drone* for 'aeroplanes without pilots'. The first were old flying machines, to which they added a radio system. A person on the ground sent radio messages to tell the aeroplane where to go. Without a message, the plane went nowhere. It just sat on the ground.
- **50.** ____ These days, drones are smaller, and we use them for business and for fun. Some drones have cameras. They can take photographs and videos. We can also deliver small packages to homes or to areas where supplies are needed.
