Hugh Jackman, "Wolverine"

Hugh Jackman has been an actor in theatre, film and TV since 1995, when he left university in Sydney, Australia. His first major role was in *Corelli* for Australian TV. He said the best thing about it was that he met his wife Deb there. After that, Hugh had a lot of acting jobs, but he became famous outside Australia when he acted in a play in London, UK.

Then, in 2000, an American company asked him to play Wolverine in *X-Men*, the films about the Marvel Comics series. He played Wolverine in nine *X-Men* movies. Until 2021, Hugh had a *Guinness World Record* for playing a Marvel character the longest.

So, Hugh Jackman has been busy. He's acted and sung and danced in many other films and plays. Hugh also plays several musical instruments. Since high school, he's played rugby and now he also does yoga. He's hosted many TV programmes including the Oscars. And, he works with several charities and started a coffee company to help farmers in Africa.

Although his great-grandfather came from Greece, Hugh was not brought up in a traditional Greek way. His parents lived in England before moving to Australia, where he was born. Now, Hugh lives in New York with his wife, Deb, and their family.

Elena Kampouris, "Paris Miller"

"Nobody ever believes me when I say I'm Greek," says the naturally blonde Elena Kampouris. But she is half-Greek. Her father moved to the USA from Kassos, Greece, where most of his family still lives.

Elena was only 18 years old in 2016 when she got a part in *My Big Fat Greek Wedding 2*. She played Paris, the teenage daughter of Toula, the Greek-American woman who married Ian, a non-Greek. Paris, like Toula, was not comfortable with her Greek family's often funny ways.

Elena was a little nervous about getting the part in Nia Vardalos' second Wedding film. The first one had been very popular and made a lot of money. She didn't want to disappoint her family. Elena got the job and, although, as she joked, she had trained for this for her whole life, she still had to dye her hair darker. The film's director didn't think she looked Greek enough.

Her Kampouris family, says Elena, is a lot like the Portokalos family in the film. When she got the part, Elena's whole family was excited. When the film opened, everyone wanted to go to the opening. Her very proud grandfather flew over from Greece.

Elena had a few roles in films before 2016 and she's acted in several films and television shows since then. Her latest part is in the Netflix series *Jupiter's Legacy*.

Many cats and dogs don't have a home. Of course, the best thing we can do is to take them into our houses and give them a home. But we [26]__ do that if we already have one or more pets.

Fortunately, there are [27]__ animal shelters that can help. Shelters give stray animals food and a place [28]__ sleep. Regenerative Farming

"Regenerative farming" can help us fight climate change. Regenerative farmers don't [41] **till** their fields. Instead, they grow plants in their fields all year.
